Disability Sensitization Program at NISWASS

11/10/2023: A disability sensitization program was organised for students of BSW (Bachelors in Social Work) and MSW (Masters in Social Work). This interactive session was organised to provide a deeper understanding of the concept of disability and the daily life of students with disabilities, along with the appreciation of the challenges faced by individuals with disabilities, specifically students with disabilities in schools and colleges. As the National Education Policy-2023 emphasises on Inclusive Education, facilitating students with and without disabilities to study in an inclusive environment, NISWASS also adheres to this philosophy. NISWASS being a school of social work supports inclusion and diversity so the efforts made by Swabhiman to bring inclusion were well accepted by the school authorities.



58 students of MSW and BSW from two different campuses NISWASS attended the program. The students were aged between 19 to 23 years. In the beginning of the session students shared their understanding of Disability which was rudimentary. Swabhiman trainers thoroughly explained the concept of disability and the types of disabilities. A simulation activity of foot painting and mouth painting was done by the students after the introduction, where the students were asked not to use their hands while painting. It proved to be an eye opener for them. The activity was fun but it also forced them to think about the challenges that the students with disabilities faced on an everyday basis and the accommodations they needed for a better living.

Examples of great personalities with disabilities were shared which inspired the students. The different causes of disabilities were explained and also that there are disabilities that are including invisible disabilities. The impact of stereotyping on a person with disability as a victim or a hero could be very adverse and that is why the unaccepted and the accepted terminologies were explained.

The existing laws in India for the persons with disabilities were explained briefly so that no rights of

any persons with disability could be breached at any point of time. In conclusion, the relevance of social work and disability and the career options in studying about disability was informed. Internship opportunity at Swabhiman where explained to the students.

The sensitization program was a great success as each student could learn about disabilities, inclusion and social work in disability.

Participation in WASH Sector Reflection Dissemination Workshop towards achieving

06/10/2023: A WASH sector follow-up reflection workshop was organised by Panchayati Raj & Drinking Water Department GoO, UNICEF, IRC, WaterAid, Water for People, and the Sustainable Sanitation Alliance. It deleberted on policies, processes, financial resources, institutional capacities, water resources management, climate change, and learning and adaptation. Anurag Gupta from WaterAid presented the recommendations from the WASH sector reflection done in May 2003 and Bhavesh Kumar Nayak, Additional Secretary from PR&DWSD gave the keynote address.



During this workshop Swabhiman suggested adaptation of gender and disability perspective to make WASH sector inclusive and sustainable. This was accepted by the participants at large, as it is not the issue of a minority section of the society but the issue of every individual. Inclusion is rather an essential component for sustainable development. The group developed strategies for advancement of the SDG 6.

Prerana Samman

13/10/2023: 9th Prerana Samman ceremony was held at Jaydev Bhawan, Bhubaneswar to celebrate the success of children with disabilities in matriculation examination. Initiated in the year 2014, it was conceptualised to recognise top scoring students with disabilities in Class X and XII examinations, in the state of Odisha. It is an effort at creating awareness about the potential of students with disabilities in Odisha and simultaneously motivating the students to improve their performance.



116 students with various disabilities were honored from across the thirty districts who will scored above 80% of marks. They received a scholarship of Rs.1200 for the academic session. Besides 12 students who secured 90% and above will received a gold medal and books worth rupees 3000; 104 students who secured between 80-89% received silver medals and books worth rupees 500 rupees. The medals, certificates, and books they were awarded at the function.

Bratati Harichandan (Disability Commissioner, Odisha), Sulochana Das (Mayor, Bhubaneswar), Retd. Cmd. Ajay Patnaik, Dr. Sruti Mohapatra (Founder and CEO Swabhiman), Brishunucharan Sutar (Joint Director of Inclusive Education) along with other dignitaries felicitated children. Each awardee was presented a certificate and badge. The awardees spoke about their struggles, about their life and achievements that became inspirational for all.

Collaborative Efforts for Pediatric Rehabilitation and Surgery in Bhubaneswar

The event hosted esteemed guests including Swami Suddhananda Giri ji, Bishnupada Sethi (IAS), Bratati Harichandan, State disability commissioner Manoj Mishra (IAS), Arvind Padhee (IAS), Poly Pattnaik, Priyadarshi Mohapatra, Sabyasachi and Archita Sahu. Taking 366 in-house participants, teacher, parents over 1000 visiting students, and participated in different competitions, workshops and activities. 
Selection of State Awardees

In collaboration with Cure Bay Health Care, a free eye check-up event identified and addressed vision-related issues. Regular blood sugar and blood pressure checks were conducted, ensuring a holistic approach to health.

Ms. Thappi's (a budding singer and Youtuber) soulful musical performance added an artistic touch, creating an enjoyable and engaging environment. The event served as a platform for showcasing talents, challenging stereotypes surrounding disabilities. Various artistic displays, performances, and exhibitions celebrated the diverse skills of individuals with SCI.

Conversations on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act 2016 and entitlements for individuals with SCI aimed to enhance awareness. Experts explored topics such as accessibility, RPwD Act provisions, entitlements, employment opportunities, and overall inclusion. The inauguration of a new building, led by Swati, a girl with intellectual disability, marked a significant moment. Among other guests were Padmalochan Mohanty, K L Mohanty, Pankaj Mohanty, Chairman and Managing Director MGM etc.

Dr. Abhisek Sanyal's inaugural speech, coupled with a group dance by the nursing staff and success story sharing by Rakesh Pradhan, added inspiration to the event. Capacity Building Programme on Equitable and Inclusive Education

22/12/2023: Tanmayee Sahu, Program Manager at Swabhiman, led a comprehensive session titled "Acts and Laws Supporting Equitable and Inclusive Education" on December 22, 2023, at the Regional Institute of Education (RIE) in Bhubaneswar. This session was an integral part of the Capacity Building Programme on Equitable and Inclusive Education organised by the National Initiative for School Heads' and Teachers' Holistic Advancement (NISHTHA) from December 18 to December 22, 2023, held at the Conference Hall of RIE campus in Bhubaneswar.



The participant comprised teacher educators hailing from various schools across four states and two Union Territories. Notably, these educators were selected on the basis of not having exposure and training in special/inclusive education from the foundational stage to the secondary stage, representing diverse educational institutions such as government and government-aided schools, those under CBSE, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Navodaya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas, and Eklavya Model Residential Schools. The intention is to build the capacity of these trained

participants to evolve as Key Resource Persons (KRPs)/Master Trainers within their respective states/UTs/Organizations, further disseminating their knowledge to train other teachers.

The primary aim of the session was to impart participants with a nuanced comprehension of concepts pertaining to Equity and Inclusion in Education. In-depth discussions were conducted on inclusion provisions, covering international frameworks such as the Salamanca Declaration of 1994, the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), and the pursuit of Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG-4). Concurrently, the discourse delved into critical national initiatives, including Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan 2001, the Right to Education Act of 2009 (RTE Act-2009), the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 (RPWD Act 2016), and the formulation of the National Education Policy in 2020 (NEP-2020).
